


DAY ONE

Upon arrival at Washington Dulles International Airport, you will find yourself in Loudoun County. Known for its picturesque rolling hills, where horses roam and winding country roads guide you through the area known as DC's Wine Country. More than 50 award-winning wineries await with private tour companies set to ensure a relaxing day spent chauffeured through charming small towns and remarkable countryside, with stops to taste some of Virginia's most lauded vintages.

Loudoun County also is famed horse and hunt country and sports a unique equine experience partnering horse and human. Just one of many offerings at Salamander Middleburg's Equestrian Center, you can explore the world of "horse whispering" first-hand, discovering new ways to communicate with man and beast.

Evening brings the chance to sample some of the area's farm-to-table cuisine with dinner at the Restaurant at Patowmack Farm. DAY THREE

Channel your inner sommelier by exploring the famous Monticello Wine Trail. But take the less traveled and even more scenic route and visit a vineyard via a private guided horseback ride amongst the vines. Or embrace a multifaceted experience at King Family Vineyards, where you can enjoy wine and delicious bites while also spectating an always entertaining polo match. And no visit to Charlottesville is complete without a stop at the UNESCO World Heritage site, Monticello, to discover why Thomas Jefferson is often called The Father of American Wine.

Make your way southwest through the mountains as you travel to Primland Resort, Auberge Resorts Collection. An evening arrival provides the perfect opportunity to experience their one-of-kind Observatory Tower and a truly mesmerizing look into our galaxy. Take part in a culinary experience you won't soon forget with a Chef's Table Tour at Pleasure House Oysters.

Experience the purest form of farm-to-table dining as you stand knee-deep in the Lynnhaven River, where a table is elegantly arranged right in the water at the oyster farm.

Cap off your trip with a relaxed evening of refined Asianfusion cuisine, expertly served at the chic Orion's Rooftop, offering sweeping panoramic vistas of the Atlantic Ocean. End with a nightcap at The Historic Cavalier's Tarnished Truth Distillery Company, the Nation's first in-hotel.
