HISTORY AHEAD

This scenic alternate to Interstate 26 enters South Carolina in the city of Landrum, passes through Spartanburg and Columbia, and ends just north of Charleston. See history come to life at these stops along the way.

BLOOMS & BEACHES

In the northern part of the state near Fort Mill, Hwy. 21 invites road trippers to get off Interstate 77 and meander. Pick up the casual route again south of Columbia and wind down all the way to the coast.

DOWN MEMORY LANE

Highway 321 cuts a direct path north to south through the middle of the state, but expect many bends in the road that lead to historic gems and natural wonders.











South Carolina is known as the Birthplace of Barbecue, and pit masters are carrying on the time-honored tradition of cooking barbecue "slow and low" at more than 220 barbecue restaurants across the state. What's more, South Carolina is the only state in the nation where you'll find all four of the basic types of barbecue sauce: mustard, light tomato, heavy tomato and vinegar and pepper. Along the coast you'll find a spicy vinegar-and-pepper sauce that dates back hundreds of years. In the Midlands you'll find a mustard-style sauce often credited as the unofficial sauce of South Carolina. In the upper middle part of the state, light tomato sauce-basically vinegar and pepper with ketchup or tomato added-is popular, while in the western and northwestern parts of the state heavy tomato sauce is favored. Most people have a strong allegiance to one sauce, so make sure you try all four before you choose sides. Download the South Carolina BBQ Trail map at SCBBQTrail.com
