ROUTE

DAY 1 PHOENIX > HOLBROOK > WINSLOW

Overview: Choose your favorite set of wheels and hit the Mother Road visiting some of Arizona's best small towns along the way. Drive from Phoenix up to Holbrook, a small town known for its roadside Americana charm.

Drive Distance Phoenix to Holbrook: 201 miles/323.48 km

Stop 1: Wigwam Motel | Holbrook

The Wigwam Motels were a motel chain in the United States during the 30s and 40s. The rooms were built in the form of tepees.

Drive Distance Holbrook to Petrified Forest National Park: 26 miles/42 km

Stop 2: Petrified Forest National Park

The only national park that the original alignment of historic Route 66 goes through, visitors can hike amongst the world's largest concentration of petrified wood. The Painted Desert is at the park's northern end, a vast area of purple, red, and orange sediments that form colorful badlands.

Drive Distance Petrified Forest National Park to Winslow: 58 miles/93.3 km

Stop 3: Standin' on The Corner Park | Winslow

The lyrics from the song "Take It Easy," made famous by "The Eagles." You can stand on the corner in historic downtown Winslow to take a photo.

DAY 2 WINSLOW > FLAGSTAFF

Overview: Flagstaff provides an ideal home base for visitors to explore some of the most spectacular scenery in the world, Route 66, a charming historic downtown with trains, shopping, art galleries, events, music, restaurants and nightlife.

Drive Distance Winslow to Meteor Crater: 26 miles/42 km

Stop 1: Meteor Crater | Winslow

On your way to Flagstaff stop by Meteor Crater. Explore and learn about the world's best preserved meteor impact site.

Drive Distance Meteor Crater to Flagstaff: 43.3 miles/70 km


Stop 2: Route 66 Walk this Talk Tour | Flagstaff

Travel along the original alignment through the redeveloped Southside Historic District. This self-guided tour begins at the Historic Train Station, passing by classic drive-in motels and Flagstaff landmarks of old. End the walking tour with a pint of local craft beer brewed in a historic building on Flagstaff's original alignment of Route 66 at Mother Road Brewing Company, one of several breweries along Flagstaff's Brewery Trail.

DAY 3 WILLIAMS > SELIGMAN > KINGMAN

Overview: Discover Williams, a town centered around a historic train depot. Route 66 history buffs can wander the six blocks of historic buildings and neon signs.

Drive Distance Flagstaff to Williams: 33 miles/53.1 km

Stop 1: Bearizona | Williams

Bearizona is a North American wildlife park that allows visitors to drive into the wilderness and witness herd and pack life from the safety and comfort of their private vehicle.

Drive Distance Williams to Seligman: 43 miles/69.2 km

Stop 2: Seligman

The birthplace of Historic Route 66, Seligman is where Angel Delgadillo, "Guardian Angel" of Route 66, founded the Historic Route 66 Association of Arizona that helped reignite interest in this iconic road. Stop by the quirky Snow Cap Drive-In for lunch and explore the Original Route 66 Gift Shop.

Drive Distance Seligman to Peach Springs: 37.3 miles/60 km

Stop 3: Grand Canvon Caverns | Peach Springs

A natural limestone cavern 210 ft underground and the largest dry cavern in the U.S. For those seeking a unique dining experience, dine 201 feet below the ground in the Crystal restaurant.

DAY 4 KINGMAN > OATMAN

Overview: Step into the spirit of the open road. From vintage charm to scenic beauty, Kingman offers the perfect mix of history, adventure, and sunshine along America's most historic highway.

Drive Distance Peach Springs to Kingman: 50.3 miles/81 km

Stop 1: The Route 66 Museum | Kingman

The Route 66 Museum depicts the historical evolution of travel along the 35th parallel that became Route 66. Brilliant murals, photos and dioramas give life to each of the groups that have traveled the route that has come to be known as the Mother Road. There is a Route 66 shield next to the Route 66 museum which you can drive through and take a photo!

Drive Distance Kingman to Oatman: 29 miles/47 km

Stop 2: Oatman

A former mining town located in the Black Mountains of Arizona, Oatman was all but abandoned in the 1960s after the gold mines closed. Today, Oatman has undergone a renaissance of sorts and wild burros (donkeys) roam freely around town.
